### Riverview Terrace Update:

- A group of organizations have formed a case management team that is working with everyone displaced from Riverview terrace. There is still a need for housing solutions for the residents that are displaced.
- Family Medical Center identified that 51 of the displaced residents are patients that receive their services. Due to this, Family Medical Center is donating, hosting a lunch for the residents, and providing hygiene kits, blood pressure checks, health tools and behavioral health resources.

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COVID-19:

- As of 08/28/2022, Lenawee County has 28,012 positive cumulative cases:
  - o 162 total active cases
  - o 27,343 discontinued from isolation and improving
  - o 335 deaths
  - o 53.7% fully vaccinated
  - o 70% is vaccination rate goal

3. Guiding Principle #3 – Peer Support & Mutual Self-Help

- a. Definition – Opportunities are created for acceptance, understanding, and validation from people with shared experiences.
- b. LHN participants shared the following examples of Peer Support & Mutual Self-Help:
  - i. At Interconnections Drop-In Center, everyone is peer support for one another. Several people were affected by Riverview Terrace closure. One person was experiencing homelessness and the staff and team provided support to the individual who was able to receive services to avoid homelessness.
  - ii. Department on Aging shared they are pivoting the vision of Day Break Programming to focus on peer support for older adults.
  - iii. The Human Services Building recently did an active shooter training. Following the training, Community Mental Health offered crisis debriefing.

- LHN participants shared examples of cultivating trustworthiness & transparency in their organization or in the community:
  - o Jackie Bradley, Lenawee Community Mental Health Authority, shared their organization developed a new strategic plan which included staff sessions and several components along the process to gather staff feedback, recommendations and to implement solutions in response.
  - o MSU-Extension shared that the Continuum of Care has cultivated relationships to incorporate representation from individual(s) with lived experience in their meetings.

4. Guiding Principle #4 – Collaboration & Mutuality:

- a. Definition – Healing happens in relationship and in the meaningful sharing of power and decision-making.
- b. The October LHN meeting will discuss examples of how Collaboration & Mutuality has been cultivated within our organizations or in the community.
