6 Principles of Trauma-Informed Care: Trustworthiness and Transparency

We shared examples of the second principle of Trauma-Informed Care: Trustworthiness and Transparency and how it shows up in our own lives and work. Some of these examples include:

- Having paper copies of feedback surveys that folks can feel comfortable submitting fully anonymously
- Getting feedback from impacted staff first, even before the Board
- Being clear about the level of decision-making power people have from the very beginning of a process.
- Including employees in the decision-making process.
- Administering an annual "voice" survey for employees that has confidential responses as well as being short and easy to complete. When people know that leaders are reading and acting on those responses, it makes a difference.
- Trustworthiness and Transparency requires a willingness to be vulnerable.

Our next principle we will discuss is Peer Support.

V. **Ongoing Strategies**

Blight Remediation

Everyone

- 1. What has happened since our last meeting?
- The City is not pursuing the Neighborhood Enhancement Program in favor of Governor Whitmer's announcement of \$21.55 million in blight elimination grant funds. The City of Adrian would be eligible for pursuing these funds.

- Community Action Agency (CAA) will also not be pursuing the Neighborhood Enhancement Program in favor of the MI Hope grant. CAA has been awarded \$350,000 for Lenawee and Hillsdale Counties to use for weatherization-related home repairs (roofs, water heaters, insulation). \$25,000 maximum can be spent on individual properties. Folks can qualify up to 200% of the federal poverty line. Specific zip codes can be focused on through this grant, such as the Eastside of Adrian in collaboration with the Ebeid Neighborhood Promise. This will be a need-based program rather than a first-come, first-serve program.
- CAA's lead abatement program is able to work in conjunction with the Healthy Homes grant to provide home repairs that don't specifically relate to lead abatement. Their funding was increased to \$80,000 more than double last year's amount!
 - 2. What did we learn?
- The homes CAA is working with are looking great!
- CAA needs to do some capacity building around their construction crew contractors are hard to come by these days!
- ProMedica identifies folks in need of home repair assistance through their social determinants of health screenings.
 - 3. What are our next steps? Who will take them and by when?
- CLINT will bring more details about the MI Hope grant process.
- EVERYONE will let Leslie know about funding opportunities and other programs that can assist folks with home repairs.
- We will think about a new initiative for us to take on at our next meeting.
 - B. <u>Increase Participation in Financial Education Programs</u>

- Homebuyer Education is scheduled for November. One of the participants even came into the bank the next day for more conversations.
- The Adrian Dominican Sisters invested \$1.5 million to the Ebeid Neighborhood Promise to support literacy and digital know-how and childhood development (in partnership with the Boys and Girls Club).

- 2nd Fridays in Parrish Park is a great place to share messages and build relationships face-to-face.
- Our goal is to change lives! Even one person coming in to set-up a savings account is a win!
- Approaching these programs with a trauma-informed approach is hugely helpful!
- Bringing in dinner and candy for prizes also helped!
