CHIP Strategy & Collaborations

Agency Spotlight Presentation:

- National Prescription Take Back Day happens in April and October each year.
- In Lenawee County, ProMedica Charles and Virginia Hickman Hospital, Lenawee County Sheriff's Department and Lenawee Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition collaborate to host medication disposal events twice a year, in alignment with national prescription disposal days.
- Next event is scheduled on April 22, 2023 from 10-2 pm at ProMedica Charles and Virginia Hickman Hospital.
- The event operates as a drive through event so community members don't need to get out of their vehicles.
- Community members can dispose of unused medications, liquids, ointments, sharps, pet medications, and inhalers.

Collective Impact Core – Trauma & Resilience Common Agenda

- The Collective Impact Core has created a temperature check survey related to the Lenawee Health Network's progress in embracing and integrating these guiding principles into practice. Six surveys have been completed to dates. Your feedback supports the LHN and Collective Impact Core to make necessary adjustments so that meetings are trauma informed and cultivate resilience. Results from the temperature check for our workgroup were shared – aggregate responses. Madeline went through the updates on the 6 components of trauma-informed care and ways our workgroup can continue working on decreasing the trauma and increasing the resiliency of our community, moving from “trauma aware” to “trauma sensitive” to “trauma responsive” to “trauma informed”.
