CHIP Strategy & Collaborations

<u>Agency Spotlight Presentation</u> – Lenawee Transportation Mobility Manager, Morgan Torres

- Morgan Torres is Lenawee County's Mobility Manager.
- A Mobility Manager helps connect individuals to transportation to access community resources. They provide Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT), Ramp Installation and connect individuals with resources to fix mobility scooters and wheelchairs.
- To link individuals to transportation, three days' notice is needed.
- Cost Morgan has a goal to get no cost transportation for each individual requesting support. She seeks providers and partners that might have insurance or resources to cover the transportation expense.
- Through April 2023, they have driven about 8,000 miles for transportation services in Lenawee County. This equates to about 265 transports completed.
- Available to all populations but children under the age of eighteen do need to have a guardian with them.
