De"Angelo introduced Moses Regalato from Family Promise of Lenawee. This is a national group that is just getting started in Lenawee Co. It is estimated that there are between 200 – 300 homeless children in Lenawee. The closest shelter for families is in Saginaw. The Neighbors of Hope is trying to open a shelter in Adrian but are facing backlash from the city. Their Tecumseh shelter for women and children has had to close. Adrian is in the top 15 of homeless cities in the nation.

It takes \$150,000 - \$200,000 to operate a shelter for a year.
